#### 1.0 Te Pūtake

Te Wānanga o Aotearoa is responsible for ensuring that international tauira have the opportunity to participate in a well-designed and age-appropriate orientation programme, including relevant advice and services to support their educational outcomes, after enrolling.

Te Wānanga o Aotearoa is committed to ensuring that tauira safety and wellbeing is our priority.

Te Wānanga o Aotearoa will ensure that the study environment is without risks to the health and safety of international tauira so far as is reasonably practicable.

Te Wānanga o Aotearoa will uphold its values, adhere to the Code of Practice and be guided by the Code Guidelines when orienting and supporting international tauira.

This Tikanga Whakahaere specifically relates to *Outcome 5: orientation, Outcome 6: safety and wellbeing, and Outcome 7: student support, advice and services* of the Code of Practice.

	2.7.	Te Wānanga o Aotearoa will ensure (in addition to 2.3 and 2.4) that appropriate measures are in place to address the needs and issues of international tauira at risk or with special needs, including where appropriate and in compliance with the principles of the Privacy Act
