Māori performing arts is full of expression that merges culture, performance and creativity.

It's used to tell the stories of the past, connect with diverse audiences and encourage self-exploration.

Designed to advance your skills and knowledge to work in and contribute to Māori performance art, this diploma will teach you how to be a kaitiaki of ngā toi Māori by becoming self-managing, assisting in leadership, and completing different projects.

This programme combines the following modules:

Learning Modules	Credits
Toi Awe - Creative Process Apply broad knowledge, practical and conceptual skills in the production of creative work.	30
Toi Iro - Exploration Analyse own and others' artistic evolution and variation, applying insights to creative work.	30
Toi Raupapa - Organisation Assist in the management, creation and completion of a toi project.	30
Toi Hanga - Creation Create and complete creative work in a chosen kaupapa toi.	30

Entry Criteria

To enrol in this programme, a potential student must:

- › be at least 16 years of age
- › be a New Zealand citizen (or citizen of Australia, Tokelau, Niue, Cook Islands) or permanent resident
- › have successfully completed Kāwai Raupapa Level 4, a Level 4 Toi Māori qualification of at least 120 credits, or a portfolio showing evidence of Level 4 equivalent experience
- › attend an interview, and selection process to demonstrate suitability to the programme.

Qualification Awarded

When you pass this programme, you'll get this qualification:

- › New Zealand Diploma in Ngā Toi Level 5 (Māori Performing Arts)

Potential Pathway

You might be eligible to enrol into a Level 6 programme with another provider.

Graduates will have the skills and knowledge to work in, or contribute to the ngā toi practice and sector. You'll also be well positioned to support and assist your whānau, hapū, iwi, and community with ngā toi projects.

Delivery & Workload

This is a full-time programme that consists of 120 credits delivered over 38 weeks. Some of our locations offer different delivery modes. These will be confirmed by your local campus and might include:

Option 1 (Face to face delivery):

- › kura whakaako - compulsory tutorials (10 hours per week)
- › 4 x 1-day wānanga (10 hours each)

You'll also need to complete learning activities designed to enhance your learning for approximately 22 hours per week.

Option 2 (Noho delivery):

- › 10 x noho (25 hours per noho)
- › 1-day wānanga (10 hours)
- › kura whakaako - compulsory tutorials (4 hours per week)

You'll also need to complete learning activities designed to enhance your learning for approximately 22 hours per week.

Some of the learning activities will need to be completed online. You'll need to have access to an internet connected device for this programme.
