



# 2 Te Ara Reo Māori (He Pī Ka Pao) Te Pōkaitahi Reo (Reo Rua) Level 2

## If you want to learn some basic Māori language, this is the perfect place to start.

Whether you want to use te reo Māori at home with the kids or in the workplace, this interactive programme will have you speaking the basics in no time.

You'll start with how to correctly pronounce Māori words, names and place names. We'll teach you basic greetings and how to introduce yourself, as well as how to understand and follow tikanga (protocols). Our kaiako are experienced with teaching beginners, and you'll be with other taura (students) who have the same aspirations to learn our indigenous language.

### This programme combines the following modules:

Learning Module	Credits
<b>Aotearoa</b> This kōnae ako (learning module) introduces taura (students) to the pronunciation of Māori words and sounds. This then enables taura to progress to informal greetings and farewells. Taura are also provided with background information as to the teaching methodology of Ako Whakatere so learners can identify their own learning styles.	15
<b>Whakapapa</b> This kōnae ako introduces taura to introduce themselves in a formal and informal setting using family relationships. It also introduces taura to understanding and using numbers. Taura will be able to follow and give some basic instructions.	15
<b>Wāhi</b> This kōnae ako introduces taura to the location of objects, people, and places. Once this is achieved, taura then have the opportunity to follow and give some basic instructions.	15
<b>Te Wā</b> This kōnae ako introduces taura to the language of time, days of the week, months, seasons of the year and dates.	15
<b>Mahi Ngahau</b> This kōnae ako introduces taura to appropriate tense markers to talk about action and statives. Taura will then ask and answer questions about the cost of something.	15
<b>Haerenga</b> This kōnae ako introduces the language of travel and holidays, and gives taura the opportunity to engage in conversational Māori about the purpose of travel and/or holiday.	15

<b>He Tikanga Marae</b> This kōnae ako introduces tauira to the various parts of the marae complex and the key roles of people. Tauira are then given the opportunity to engage in conversational Māori on this subject.	<b>15</b>
<b>Tangata Rongonui</b> This kōnae ako introduces tauira to the language of the third person. Tauira then will be able to display confidence and competency when speaking in te reo Māori.	<b>15</b>

### Entry Criteria

To enrol in this programme, a potential student must be:

- › be at least 16 years of age
- › be a New Zealand citizen (or citizen of Australia, Tokelau, Niue, Cook Islands) or permanent resident
- › have little or no knowledge of te reo Māori
- › attend an information session with a kaiako.

### Qualification awarded

When you pass this programme, you'll get these qualifications:

- › New Zealand Certificate in Te Reo (Reo Rua) Level 1 - Te Pōkaitahi Reo (Reo Rua) Te Kaupae 1
- › New Zealand Certificate in Te Reo (Reo Rua) Level 2 - Te Pōkaitahi Reo (Reo Rua) Te Kaupae 2

### Potential Careers & Pathways

#### I want to keep studying

Take this to the next level with Te Ara Reo Māori Level 4, or dive into total immersion with Te Pūtaketanga o te Reo.

#### I want to use my qualification

Your reo Māori skills will be useful in everyday life in Aotearoa. They'll also be great if you work in education, Māori organisations, media or anywhere you deal with the public.

### Delivery & Workload

This is a full-time programme that consists of 120 credits delivered over 38 weeks. Throughout the programme you will be required to attend:

- › 1 x 3-hour class per week
- › 2 x noho marae (26 hours each)
- › 4 x one-day wānanga (8 hours each)

Your kaiako will confirm the dates and venues for your noho/one-day wānanga.

You'll be expected to complete activities outside of class time via our Akorau learning platform for approximately 28 hours per week. You'll need to have access to an internet connected device for this programme.
