| Hokinga Mahara This kōnae ako (module) will give taura the opportunity to revise and refresh their knowledge of Level 4 grammar with the intention of extending on and consolidating relevant grammatical structures in a range of contexts, to develop language skills in written and verbal forms. | 15 |
| Ngā Āhuatanga o te Reo This kōnae ako will enable taura to identify and apply correct grammar using a wide range of grammatical structures and language patterns at an advanced level. | 15 |
| Kōrero Nehe This kōnae ako will examine historical events and traditional texts with a particular focus on whakataukī, ngā momo waiata and pakiwaitara. | 15 |
| Te Taiao This kōnae ako will give taura the opportunity to examine and demonstrate understanding of pūrākau in relation to the taiao. | 15 |
| Te Hekenga o Ngā Waka This kōnae ako will enable taura to discuss Te Hekenga o Ngā Waka including reasons behind the migration. Taura will also examine the various roles and responsibilities of people on board. | 15 |
| Whakapūrongo This kōnae ako will give taura an opportunity to discuss and debate historical or current events and demonstrate knowledge and application of mātauranga Māori research methods. | 15 |
| Kupu Whakanikoniko This kōnae ako will focus on identifying and interpreting the use of metaphorical language. Taura will be given the opportunity to demonstrate appropriate use of kupu whakanikoniko. | 15 |

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| Te Marae This kōnae ako will enable taura to identify and articulate the significance of the pōwhiri process. Taura will also explain significant features of the marae and the roles and responsibilities of key people hosting a hui in a marae setting. | 15 |

Entry Criteria

To enrol in this programme, a potential taura must:

- › be at least 16 years of age
 - › be a New Zealand citizen (or citizen of Australia, Tokelau, Niue, Cook Islands) or permanent resident
 - › have successfully completed Te Pūtaketanga o te Reo Level 4, or Te Ara Reo Māori (He Pī Ka Rere) Level 4, or an equivalent te reo Māori qualification at Level 4
 - › attend an interview or information hui with a kaiako
- or**
- › have successfully completed the Pre-Entry Assessment (PEA) – direct entries only
 - › attend an interview or information hui with a kaiako.

- › New Zealand Diploma in Te Reo (Rumaki) Level 5

With skills at this level you could provide cultural advice in your workplace or organisation.

Delivery & Workload

This is a full-time programme that consists of 120 credits delivered over 40 weeks. Some of our locations offer different delivery modes. These will be confirmed by your local campus and might include:

Option 1

- › weekly wānanga (6 hours per week)
- › 4 x 1-day wānanga (8 hours)

Activity directed learning will also need to be completed outside of class time for approximately 26 hours per week.

Option 2

- › 1 x weekly wānanga (3 hours)
- › 8 x noho marae (26 hours)

Activity directed learning will also need to be completed outside of class time for approximately 25 hours per week.

Online learning requirements: Please note that taura will be required to have access to a quality learning device in order to complete planned learning activities outside of scheduled classes, noho and wānanga.
