This programme offers students the opportunity to start specialising in a particular area of weaving. Depending on your location you may have the option of mahi raranga, whatu, tāniko, tukutuku or working with different fibres.

You'll learn various toi (art) techniques and practices through a number of project-based tasks. These projects will teach you the creative processes involved to complete your work and the planning skills to manage your time.

To enrol in this programme, a potential student must:

- › be at least 16 years of age
- › be a New Zealand citizen (or citizen of Australia, Tokelau, Niue, Cook Islands) or permanent resident
- › reside in New Zealand
- › attend an interview and selection process to demonstrate suitability to the programme.

Delivery & Workload

This is a full-time programme that consists of 120 credits delivered over 38 weeks. Throughout the programme you'll need to attend:

- › 10 x noho marae (25 hours per noho)
- › kura whakaako - compulsory tutorials (5 hours per week)
- › 2 x 1-day wānanga (10 hours per wānanga)

Activity directed learning will also need to be completed outside of class time, amounting to approximately:

- › 21 hours per week.

Some of the learning activities will need to be completed online. You'll need access to an internet-connected device for this programme.
