Delivery & Workload

This is a part-time programme that consists of 60 credits delivered over 52 weeks. These activities will require at least:

- ▶ 12 hours of learning per week

Most of the learning activities will need to be completed online through our student learning platform, Akorau. This means you'll need access to the internet and a computer/laptop/tablet to complete the course. While you could use a smartphone, for a better learning experience we recommend using a device with a larger screen like a laptop or tablet.

You'll still receive visits from your kaitiaki (support person). They'll be in touch with you to arrange suitable visiting times.

In your first and third months of studying, you'll receive a resource kete (pack) via courier. These resources will be used alongside Akorau to complete various activities.
