## Entry Criteria

To enrol in this programme, a potential student must:

- > be at least 16 years of age
- be a New Zealand citizen (or citizen of Australia, Tokelau, Niue, Cook Islands) or permanent resident
- > reside in New Zealand
- have successfully completed a te reo Māori qualification at level 2, or
- attend an information sharing evening with a Kaiako to determine the applicant's level of te reo Māori

# Delivery & Workload

This is a part-time programme that consists of 60 credits, taught over 38 weeks. Some of our locations offer different delivery modes. These will be confirmed by your local campus and might include:

#### Option 1 – Classroom-based

- > 1 x kura whakaako (an average of 2.66 hours per fortnight)
- > 2 x 1-day wānanga (8 hours each)
- > 1 x noho marae (25 hours)

#### Option 2 – Noho/wānanga-based

- > 8 x 1-day wānanga (8 hours each)
- > 1 x noho marae (25 hours)
