Entry Criteria

To enrol in this programme, a potential student must:

- › be at least 16 years of age
- › be a New Zealand citizen (or citizen of Australia, Tokelau, Niue, Cook Islands) or permanent resident
- › reside in New Zealand
- › be fully committed to completing the programme
- › attend either (or both) an information session or enrolment interview

Delivery & Workload

This programme consists of 60 credits delivered over 19 weeks. Throughout the programme you will be required to attend:

- ▶ 1 x weekly wānanga whāiti (3 hours per session)
- ▶ 5 x noho marae (22-25 hours per noho)

Additional learning outside of class time will also need to be completed for approximately:

- ▶ 21.5 hours per week

Some of the learning activities will need to be completed online. You'll need to have access to an internet-connected device to complete some learning activities.

Demonstrate knowledge of rangatiratanga to tiaki kuia and koroua. Demonstrate knowledge of palliative care to tiaki kuia and koroua. Demonstrate knowledge of tangihanga.
