Te Ara Reo Māori Level 2

Learn how to speak the Māori language in a fun and supportive environment.

This programme is our part-time study option. It's designed to provide you with more flexibility to learn te reo Māori at a slower pace without the impact to your lifestyle commitments.

Start to become confident putting your new conversational skills to use by learning about different tense markers that help you to describe when things have happened, and asking and answering basic questions.

You'll also be able to identify, describe and explain -at a foundational level- various parts of the marae, people and visiting different places.



Entry Criteria

To enrol in this programme, a potential student must:

- > be at least 16 years of age
- be a New Zealand citizen (or citizen of Australia, Tokelau, Niue, Cook Islands) or permanent resident
- reside in New Zealand
- > have little or no knowledge of te reo Māori
- have completed Te Pōkaitahi Reo (Rumaki, Reo Rua) (Te Kaupae 1) - New Zealand Certificate in Te Reo (Rumaki, Reo Rua) (Level 1) or hold a comparative qualification

Delivery & Workload

This is a part-time programme that consists of 60 credits, taught over 38 weeks. Some of our locations offer different delivery modes. These will be confirmed by your local campus and might include:

Option 1 - Classroom-based

- 1 x kura whakaako (3 hours per fortnight)
- > 2 x 1-day wānanga (8 hours each)
- > 1 x noho marae (25 hours)
