Introduction

iReo 3 helps you build the confidence to talk about your whānau, introduce the people important to you, and express relationships naturally through te reo Māori. You'll learn how to describe relationships, introduce the people important to you, and build confidence using these phrases in everyday settings. This programme is designed for learners continuing from iReo 1 and iReo 2 who want to make their reo more personal, practical, and connected to real life.

Why choose this programme?

- **Strengthen whānau connection.** Learn how to talk about the people who matter most to you using te reo Māori in a way that feels natural and meaningful.
- **Build confidence for real conversations.** Practise introducing whānau members, describing relationships, and using everyday language in social and community settings.
- **Learn in a supportive environment.** Designed for learners continuing their reo journey with step-by-step guidance, pronunciation tools, and practical examples.
- **Study flexibly online.** Access your learning anywhere with flexible online delivery.

What you'll learn

By the end of iReo 3, you'll be able to:

- Use terms of address and endearment in different contexts
- Talk about whakapapa and whānau relationships using simple phrases
- Introduce members of your whānau in te reo Māori
- Create a mihi mihi that introduces your whānau connections
- Improve your pronunciation and confidence in spoken reo Māori
- Use simple relationship-focused language in everyday conversations
- Build confidence engaging with Māori language and culture

The course is divided into six modules, designed so that you can complete one per week. However, you can complete them in whatever order you choose.

- Week 1: Use different terms of address and endearment in different contexts.
- Week 2: Use simple phrases to state whakapapa and whānau relationships.
- Week 3: Introduce family members.
- Week 4: Understand the purpose and importance of mihimihi.
- Week 5: Create a mihimihi to introduce family members.
- Week 6: Course summary & daily practice.

Who this programme is for

iReo 3 is designed for:

- Learners who have completed iReo 1 and iReo 2
- Māori living overseas wanting to strengthen cultural and whānau connections
- Learners wanting to build confidence speaking about family and relationships in te reo Māori
- Parents and whānau learning reo Māori together
- People wanting practical, culturally grounded language for everyday life
- Learners looking for a supportive next step in their reo journey

How learning works and what you'll need

- Fully online and self-directed
- 6-week programme, about 30 hours total
- Around 3–5 hours per week
- Learn at your own pace
- Accessible on desktop, tablet, or mobile

You'll have:

- 8 weeks full access to learning materials
- 4 weeks additional read-only access for revision after completion

This is a self-directed course where you'll facilitate your own learning using our online resources. Throughout your study you'll be supported by a kaiāwhina (support person) and join our online learning community.

What You Need / Technical Requirements

Physical Items:

1. Digital device with camera and microphone to attend online events (e.g. a laptop, PC, tablet and/or a smartphone)
2. Headset or earphones (recommended)
3. Reliable broadband internet connection
4. Pen and paper if you wish to write your own notes.

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Frequently Asked Questions

Can I access the materials after the course? Yes, all participants have 8 weeks of full access to complete the course plus an additional 4 weeks read-only access to review their learnings.

Are there assessments? No, however there are tasks and quizzes to help test your knowledge. Tasks and quizzes can be repeated as many times as you'd like.

Will I receive a certificate of completion? Yes, certificates will be emailed on successful completion of the course.

Can I register for multiple courses? Yes, you can register for multiple courses. For the best experience, we suggest taking them one at a time rather than all at once.

What support is available? A kaiāwhina (support person) is available via the online community in your digital classroom. The kaiāwhina will answer pātai (questions) asked in the forum. We highly encourage learners to participate in the forum and provide peer-to-peer support to each other too.
